

The Funding Request is the second step of a three-part application process to access funding from the City of Toronto's Home Energy Loan Program (HELP) (the "Program"). **Applicants are required to first complete an Application and obtain a HELP File Reference Number before proceeding to this step.**

This checklist is provided to assist Applicants in preparing the required items for submission to the City as accompaniment to the Funding Request form:

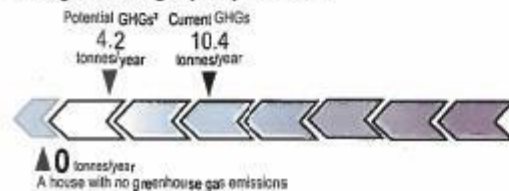
